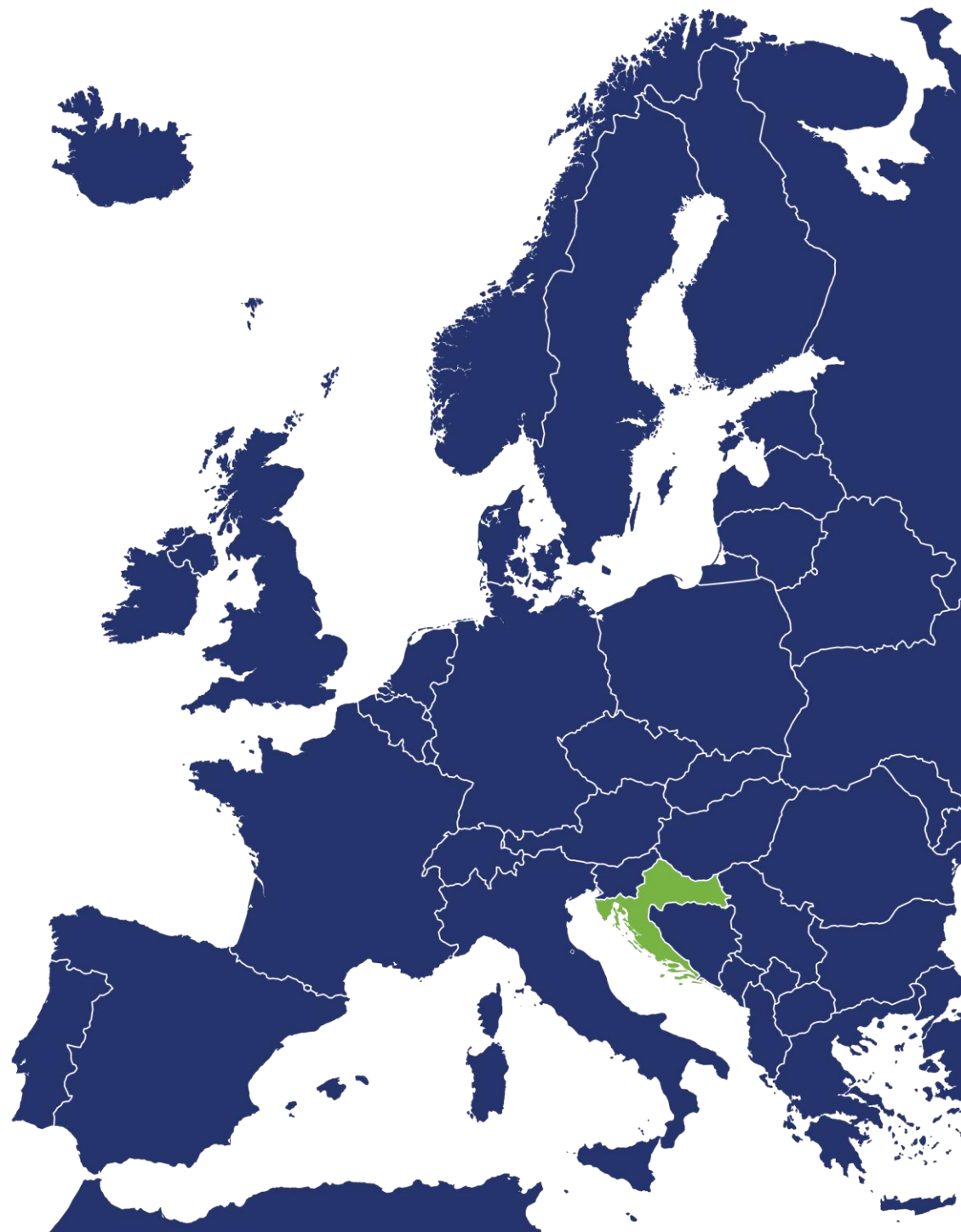


NIS2 across the EU

Croatia

As NIS2 is implemented across the EU, we are tracking the key features and important differences arising under local legislation.

In the next of our local country updates, we look at Croatia.



The Legislation

- The Cybersecurity Act is already in force.
- There is a draft bylaw currently in the public consultation process and is expected to come into force by the end of this year.

Liability & Enforcement

- Members of management bodies may be fined up to EUR 6,000 depending on the violation and/or type of entity.
- Management obligations include:
 - Approving the cybersecurity risk-management measures
 - Oversee the implementation of cybersecurity risk-management measures
 - Follow cybersecurity training as well as having it organised for all staff.

Registration and Main Establishment

- Croatia has fully implemented the main establishment principle.
- Central State Body for Cybersecurity will register the entities.
- The registration method will be regulated by the bylaw.

Infosec Requirements

- The incoming bylaw to the Cybersecurity Act will set out the specific risk-management measures.
- The Cybersecurity Act does not require the regulators to recognize industry certifications as conclusive evidence of having appropriate cyber security measures in place.
